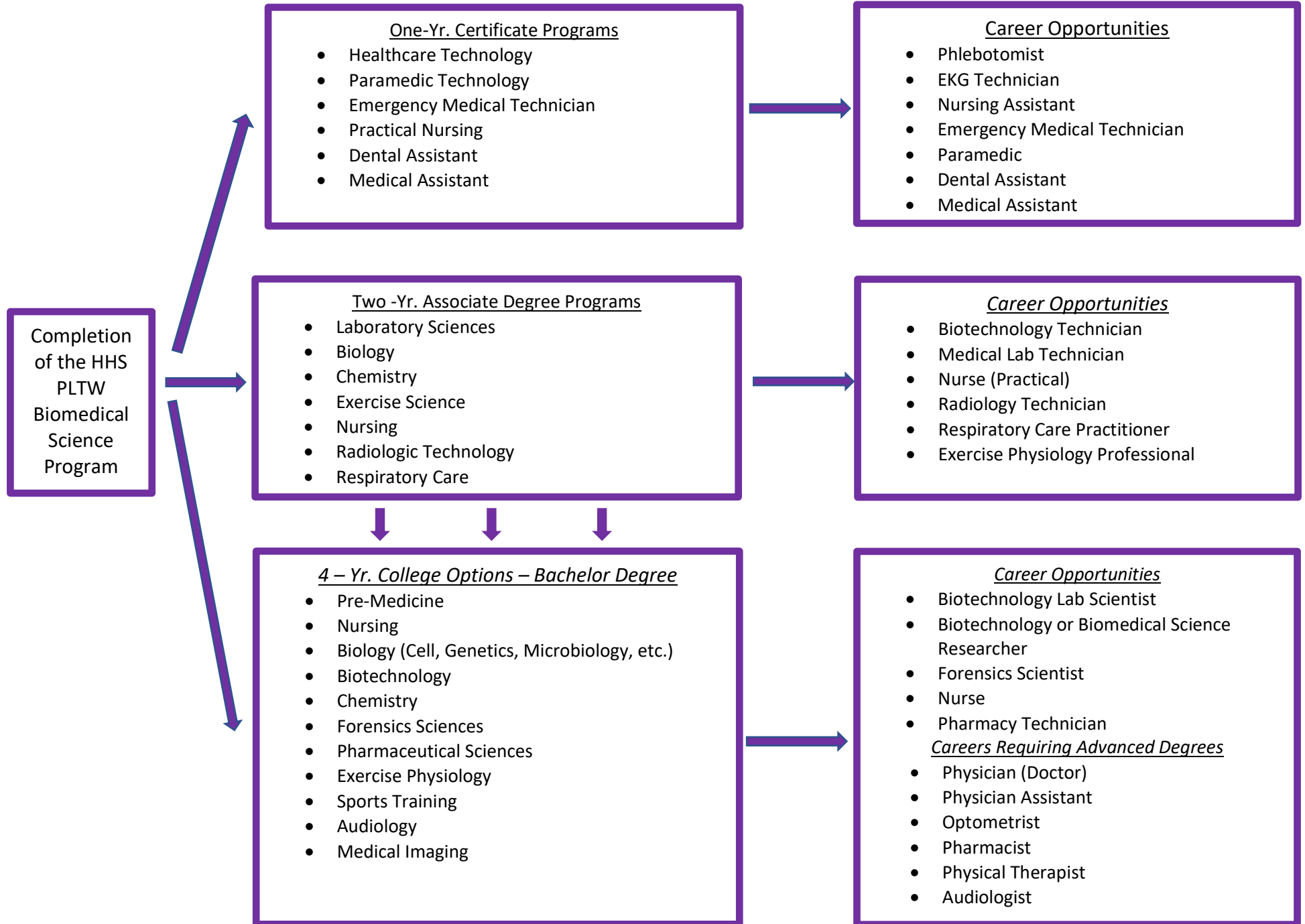

Post-Secondary College and Career Training Options

After graduation, HHS Biomedical Science students can continue their education through certificate or college degree programs at public or private colleges & universities.

Students can earn a one-year certificate or a two-year Associate Degree *right here in Haverhill, MA* at [Northern Essex Community College \(NECC\)!!](#) NECC is a **public** college and in addition to the main Haverhill campus, it also has a campus in downtown Lawrence. The Haverhill NECC campus is less than three miles from Haverhill City Hall and NECC students ride the MVRTA bus for free!!

After earning a two-year Associate Degree at NECC, students in many academic programs can transfer to a school in the **public** University of Massachusetts system, or the state college & university system.

- The Massachusetts State College & University system is a different system than UMass and has many campuses,
